#### Welcome

This year, we have changed our phonics programme across school. Our new programme is called Sounds-Write.

Miss Hedley is our Literacy Lead. She began leading Reading and Phonics in September when we started our new phonics scheme.

Today is our first Sounds-Write workshop for parents / carers. We plan to hold a workshop every term to discuss Reading and Phonics.



#### What is Sounds-Write?

Sounds-Write is a highly effective phonics programme which is used around the world to teach children how to read and spell.

### Conceptual Knowledge

- 1. Letters are symbols (spellings) that represent sounds.
- 2. A sound may be spelled by 1, 2, 3 or 4 letters.

  dog street night dough
- 3. The same sound can be spelled in more than one way.

  rain break gate stay
- 4. Many spellings can represent more than one sound.

  One spelling, different sounds head, seat, break



#### Skills

Blending - the ability to push sounds together to build words.

 $/k//a//t/ \rightarrow cat$ 

Segmenting - the ability to pull apart the individual sounds in words.

 $pig \rightarrow /p//i//g/$ 

Phoneme (Sound) Manipulation - the ability to insert sounds into words and delete sounds out of words.


<o> Is it /o/ as in 'hot', /oe/ as in 'no', or /u/ as in 'son'?

## What happens in school?


- All children take part in a daily phonics lesson.
- Phonics is taught by your child's class teacher.
- Each lesson lasts approximately 45 minutes.
- Lessons consist of reading and writing activities.
- New knowledge is introduced and previous knowledge is continually revisited.




### What do Sounds-Write lessons look like?



















## Let's play a Sound Swap game...

We play Sound Swap to keep the children's phoneme manipulation skills sharp.

Write these sounds on the sticky notes on your table.



We are going to make different nonsense words by changing one sound each time. Then we will say the sounds and read the word.

#### Decodable Books

Decodable books contain words that your child can work out using their phonic skills.

We have invested in brand new books linked to our new phonics programme.

All books are matched to the sounds your child has been taught in school.



## The Importance of Re-Reading

Our aim is for children to be able to read most of their book by sight after lots of practise.

Re-reading builds fluency, confidence and reading success.

Children show a better understanding of what they have read when they don't have to 'sound out' lots of words.



## Sight Vocabulary

Some words cannot be 'sounded out' (e.g. said, the, what). Therefore, children must learn to recognise these common words by sight.

When we come across these words in books, we explain to the children that these words cannot be 'sounded out' and we tell them the word. With lots of practise, they will begin to recognise these words automatically.


## How can you help?

Try to listen to your child read every day.

If they get stuck on a word, encourage them to say the sounds and read the word.

All children are taught pure letter sounds. Please promote this at home too (e.g. we don't add 'uh' onto the end of sounds - say 'sss' not 'suh', 'mmm' not 'muh').

#### Intent
