### Uniform

As a school, Spring Gardens recognises the importance of high attendance.


Whilst there are many reasons that children may be out of school it is imperative that children attend to ensure they are able to progress and retain the learning

- As we have children with allergies in school, NO NUT BASED PRODUCTS should be included in packed lunches. If a child is known to have a nut based product this will be removed from their packed lunch and given to the adult collecting at the end of the day



## Curriculum - Example of a Curriculum Overview

#### Literacy

-We will recite and perform the classic story 'Dogger' by Shirley Hughes. We will create LOST posters to describe missing toys and we will talk about how we would feel if we lost our favourite toy. We will write our own versions of the story 'Dogger' by editing the original text. Finally, we will invent our own 'Losing Tales'.




#### PSHE - E-Safety & Financial Understanding

Fractions - recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity. Place Value - explore numbers to 50, count forwards and backwards, count in 2s 5s & 10s, identify one more/less, read and write numbers in words and numerals, represent numbers using objects and pictures.
