## Expectations for next year

### **Uniform**

As a school, Spring Gardens recognises the importance of high attendance.


Whilst there are many reasons that children may be out of school it is imperative that children attend to ensure they are able to progress and retain the learning.

- Gates locked 8:55am


Please make sure your child is in the line to come in with their class **at 8:50am** so they have a calm and controlled start to their day

#### Literacy

Fiction: We will explore the story 'Stone Age Boy'. The children will complete a range of reading, drama and writing activities linked to the story.

Non-Fiction: We will write a non-chronological report about The Stone Age.

Poetry: We will explore a diamante poem about a caveman and then write our own poems.

#### Pedestrian Training

We will take part in North Tyneside Council's pedestrian training course. Children will learn about road safety and the best places to cross the road. They will learn how to cross the road at different ŝ 🛛 🚽 junctions and how to be aware of different road users/traffic.

#### Maths

In our first units of maths children will continue to develop their understanding of 2 and 3 digit numbers. They will practice adding and subtracting using equipment and mental methods and use column methods for more complex calculations.

#### Times tables:

We will recap the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and introduce the 3 times table



#### PSHE: TEAM

Together everyone achieves more. This half term we will be looking at how working as a class team has a positive impact on all of its members and what they can achieve.

#### Art: Gestural Drawing with Charcoal

The children will explore cave art and discover how to make drawings that capture a sense of drama or performance

#### PE: Health Related Fitness & Gymnastics

Children will take part in high intensity 🧖 circuits to develop their fitness levels. In Gymnastics, they will perform a range 💙 of rolls with increasing control and create a sequence of movements

#### Science: Rocks

In RE, we will be investigating the

different ways in which Hindus worship.

Children will learn about the different properties of rocks and how to group them. They will recognise that soil comes from rocks and also learn how fossils are formed


## **Collection Policy**
