Literacy

Please continue to support your child at home in learning their common words. These can be found in the back of their homework books.

Reading: Reading sessions will continue to take place weekly and children will read with the teacher once across the week.

Grammar: We will continue to concentrate on being consistent with a range of grammatical devices. This term, there will also be a focus on writing and punctuating fronted adverbials and direct speech.

Writing: We will be exploring the fictional tale of Beowulf to create our own five part story. We will also read and write explanation texts.

Science

In Science we will be finding out about states of matter. We will be investigating reversible and irreversible changes in the context of chocolate and water.

RE

In RE we will be exploring why is Lent such an important period for Christians.

Maths

We will be working on mastering formal methods for multiplication. We will be learning about the area of 2D shapes and how to draw and translate polygons using co-ordinates. Design Technology

Making a torch - We will be designing and creating our own torch using a simple circuit. We will be investigating different models and evaluating our finished product.

Computing

We will be investigating 3D modelling and designs, looking at both architectural designs of buildings and sculpture models. By the end of term, we will create our own project!

History -

BIG QUESTION - Who were the Anglo Saxons? Following on from the Roman invasion of Britain and the decrease of the Roman Empire, we will begin to develop our understanding of the Anglo Saxons and what attracted them to the British Isles. We will focus on the Saxon kings and the Saxon way of life.

We will explore place names and settlements, clothes, houses and how they lived. We will end our topic with a visit to Jarrow Hall to experience life first-hand as an Anglo-Saxon.



PE
